






Deprivation


This chart shows the percentage of the population who live in areas at each level of deprivation.

Proportion of overall deprivation, 2015




Healthcare

- Between 2015 and 2017, premature mortality rates (under 75) from cardiovascular disease are significantly worse than the regional and national averages.
- 61.6% (143 out of 232) of all early deaths from cardiovascular disease are considered preventable.
- Premature mortality rates from cardiovascular disease are higher for men (153.2 per 100,000) than for women (69.3 per 100,000).
- Premature mortality rates from cardiovascular disease have reduced by 9.4% since 2001/03.
- In 2017/18, emergency hospital admissions due to falls for people over 65 were similar to the national average.
- In 2017/18, the rate of emergency admissions for hip fractures in people aged 65-79 in Lincoln was similar to the national average.
- In 2018, screening coverage for breast, cervical and bowel cancers were significantly worse than the national average.


Health Inequalities

- Life expectancy is 8.6 years lower for men and 7.5 years lower for women in the most deprived areas of Lincoln compared to the least deprived.
- Average life expectancy in Lincoln is 77.3 years for men and 80.9 years for women.
- Average female life expectancy in Lincoln is significantly worse to the national average of 83.1 years, while average male life expectancy is significantly worse than the national average of 79.5 years.

Child Health


- 13.3% of children (under 16s) live in low income families.
- 16.3% of mothers are known to smoke at the time of delivery.
- 55.8% of mothers breastfeed their babies in the first 48 hours after delivery.
 This is worse than the national average of 74.5%.
- 80.7% of children under 5 are free from dental decay, which is worse than the national average of 76.7%.
- Under-18 conceptions in Lincoln (26.7 per 1,000 females aged 15-17) are similar to the national rate of 18.8 per 1,000.
- The rate of hospital admissions caused by unintentional and deliberate injuries is significantly worse than the national rate.
- 45.8% of pupils achieved a standard pass (9-4) in GCSE English and Maths in 2017
- Pupil absence rates in Lincoln are worse than the national average.

Adult Health

- 18.5% of the population are reported to have a limiting long term illness or disability and 5.3% report their general health to be 'bad or very bad'.
- 74.7% of working age adults are in employment, which is similar to the England average of 75.2%.
- The gap in employment rates between those with a long-term condition and the total population is significantly worse than the national gap.
- Smoking prevalence among adults in Lincoln (16.3%) is similar to the national average of 14.9%.
- Between 2015 and 2017 the rate of people killed or seriously injured on roads in Lincoln is similar to the national average.
- The rate of hospital admissions for alcohol related conditions is similar in Lincoln compared to the national average.
- Estimated diabetes diagnosis is similar to the national average.


Hospital inpatient admissions for mental health disorders (all ages), 2016/17





People aged 18-64 predicted to have a mental health problem, 2017 - 2035




People aged 65+ predicted to have depression, 2017 - 2035



- 2011 Census data shows there are 2,447 unpaid carers providing substantial care (more than 50 hours a week) in Lincoln, which equates to 2.6% of the total population.
- At electoral ward level, provision of substantial unpaid care varies from 4.2% in Moorland to 1.7% in Carholme Ward.
- Lincoln has a population of 15.1% aged over 65

Provision of one hour or more of unpaid care per week, 2011





Provision of 50 hours or more of unpaid care per week, 2011





Provision of 50 hours or more of unpaid care per week, by electoral ward, 2011




- In 2017/18, 25.6% of Reception Year children were overweight or obese. This is worse than the national average.
- Excess weight in Reception year children saw an increase between 2015/16 and 2017/18
- By Year 6, 37.1% of children are overweight or obese. This is the similar to the national average.
- Excess weight in Year 6 children has increased from 35.5% in 2015/16.
- In 2016/17, 60.7% of adults aged over 18 in Lincoln were overweight or obese, which is similar than the national average.
- In 2016/17, 55.3% of adults were meeting the recommended '5-a-day' on a usual day, which is similar to the national average.

Year 6 children (age 10/11) who are overweight or obese, 2017/18






Adults (18+) who are overweight or obese, 2016/17


Dementia diagnosis rate (age 65+), 2018








Physically active adults, 2016/17

Physically active populations in Lincoln







Highest levels of inactivity in Lincolnshire population







Highest levels of activity in Lincolnshire population






Children and young people activity levels by district
